Course Description

In K3, learning with each other through play helps support children's social and emotional development, language and literacy, cognition, and even physical development. The class begins with a large group time that includes calendar, sharing time, and reading stories related to the theme of the day. Group time allows students to practice a variety of classroom skills such as listening skills, conversational skills, interacting with the teacher, and how to read a story. Small group centers are used to give students experience doing many different activities related to the theme/lesson of the day. Concentration is placed on learning and practicing classroom etiquette: listening, raising hands, lining up, being kind to others, obeying the teacher, using inside voices, and keeping hands to oneself. The class focuses on one letter of the alphabet, number, shape, and color per week and does thematic activities based on all five of these emphases. We feel children learn more and will retain more when they are enjoying what they are doing, so our curriculum involves activities that get the children to move and explore. Hands-on learning allows the children to experience and develop the senses that God has given them.

Throughout the school year, students will develop skills such as:

- identifying colors, shapes, numbers, and letters
- recognizing patterns
- sharing, compromising, and following directions

Music Class: Students attend music class once a week. The students will enjoy experiencing music in a variety of ways. We explore music through a repertoire rich in folk songs, nursery rhymes, and traditional singing games. We learn about music through imitation, movement, listening, visualization, improvisation, finger play, and rhythm instruments. Seasonal music activities are incorporated throughout the year.

Art Class (2 Day Model only): Students will attend art class once a week. K3-2nd grade students' study of art will encourage them to better see and appreciate God's own artistic brilliance in His lavish creation. Quality children's literature will be used to teach various art elements such as shape, line, texture, color, value, form and space. Students will put their learning into action using a variety of media and hands-on learning.

ONE DAY MODEL:

The K4 class is a series of thematic units incorporating both fiction and nonfiction literature, science, music, gross- and fine-motor skills, language arts, math, social studies, and Bible. Class begins with group time, which includes listening skills, conversational skills, interacting with the teacher, and reading a story. Concentration is placed on learning and practicing classroom etiquette: listening, raising hands, lining up, being kind to others, obeying the teacher, using inside voices, and keeping hands to oneself. The class focuses on one letter of the alphabet per week and does thematic activities based on the letter of emphasis each class day.

- **Music Class:** Students attend music class each class day. The students will enjoy experiencing music in a variety of ways. We explore music through a repertoire rich in folk songs, nursery rhymes, and traditional singing games. We learn about music through imitation, movement, listening, visualization, improvisation, finger play, and rhythm instruments. Seasonal music activities are incorporated throughout the year.

TWO DAY MODEL:

Course Description

In the one and two day model, the K5 class curriculum is designed revolving around weekly themes. Through these weekly themes, literacy, math, social studies, and science skills and concepts are taught. The lessons incorporate large group activities along with small group learning centers. Children gain social skills, practice problem-solving, and learn about themselves, their environment, and others through active play. They are encouraged to love learning, develop early literacy skills, and interact with others in a classroom setting.

Students attending the two day model learn about the same weekly theme for both Monday and Wednesday. This allows children to do more activities and dive deeper into the weekly themes since they have two full days together.

Literacy concepts are tied together with our weekly themes. With quality literature, children are modeled on proper book handling, directionality, along with good reader strategies like previewing, predicting, and retelling. Foundational reading skills are

introduced such as letter-sound connections, letters vs. words, words vs. sentences, and sight words.

Math concepts are introduced throughout the day. Morning calendar time allows introduction to counting, patterning, and days and months. Learning centers offer individual and small group work focusing on specific concepts such as one-to-one correspondence, graphing, patterning, sorting, and measuring.

Science and Social Studies concepts are covered throughout the week, based on the weekly theme. For example, when studying apples and pumpkins, children learn of the growth cycle of a seed, and are given hands-on experiences with actual apples and pumpkins. During Community Helpers, the class grows in understanding of the many different jobs that help us live in our home community.

On the three or four days per week children are at home (depending on your model), parents should focus on Math and English Language Arts content areas using the selected curriculum you have chosen to work with your K5 student.

Students in the one day model enjoy Music each class day. Students in the two day model will take Music and Art class once weekly as part of their class day.

Course Description

ONE DAY MODEL:

In this 1st grade model, the children are with the same teacher the entire day and stay together as a group, with the exception of a music class when they go to the respective teacher for that time.

In first grade, social studies content will be covered at co-op each week. Additionally, each week students will explore simple machines through a LEGO curriculum. The children will rotate through learning stations in small groups to maximize learning time. We will focus on learning about U.S. History using ***Our Star-Spangled Story, Part 1***. This book has 45 lessons beginning with life in America before Europeans

came and continuing through the late 1800s. Students will learn about history from a Christian worldview through hands-on activities, songs, and dances. Notgrass curriculum company recommends eight works of literature to read along with the lessons in *Our Star-Spangled Story*. The UHC teacher does not have time to read these books aloud in class but we highly recommend that families read through them at home with their students. Each book gives your child a richer perspective on a certain time period. The student has 3-5 weeks to read each book.

The following literature books are recommended for Part 1, which is covered in 1st grade at UHC:

- Benjamin West and His Cat Grimalkin by Marguerite Henry (Units 1-4)

TWO DAY MODEL:

In this two day model, the class day is team taught with one 1st grade teacher who teaches Science and another 1st grade teacher who teaches Social Studies. Class sections are assigned one of those teachers as their homeroom teacher as well. Additionally, the 1st grade classes go to music and art class with the respective teachers for that time.

In first grade, both science and social studies content will be covered at co-op each week. Age appropriate math facts and sight words will also be practiced weekly. The children will rotate through learning stations in small groups to maximize learning time.

- **Social Studies component:** In first grade, we will focus on learning about U.S. History using ***Our Star-Spangled Story Part 1***. This book has 45 lessons beginning with life in America before Europeans came and continuing through the late 1800s. Students will learn about history from a Christian worldview

through hands-on activities, songs, and dances. Notgrass curriculum company recommends eight works of literature to read along with the lessons in Our Star-Spangled Story. The UHC teacher does not have time to read these books aloud in class but we highly recommend that families read through them at home with their students. Each book gives your child a richer perspective on a certain time period. The student has 3-5 weeks to read each book.

Course Description

ONE DAY MODEL:

In this one day model, the children are with the same teacher the entire day and stay together as a group, with the exception of a music class when they go to the respective teacher for that time.

The second grade class explores science unit studies based on the Magic School Bus series, enabling great flexibility as we explore a wide variety of science topics. This approach provides the opportunity for each child in class to learn about one or more of their favorite science topics. In addition, this literature-based approach to science provides yet another opportunity for these young learners to further develop their reading skills with what is sure to be a familiar and well-received collection of books. The children will engage in developmentally appropriate activities that will help them better understand the topics that they are studying.

- **Music Class:** Students attend music class each class day. The students will enjoy experiencing music in a variety of ways. We explore music through a

repertoire rich in folk songs, nursery rhymes, and traditional singing games. We learn about music through imitation, movement, listening, visualization, improvisation, finger play, and rhythm instruments. Seasonal music activities are incorporated throughout the year.

TWO DAY MODEL:

In this two day model, the class day is team taught with one 2nd grade teacher who teaches Science and another 2nd grade teacher who teaches Social Studies. Class sections are assigned one of those teachers as their homeroom teacher as well. Additionally, the 2nd grade classes go to music and art class with their respective teachers for that time.

In second grade, both science and social studies content will be covered at co-op each week. As part of our weekly learning, we will use quality children's literature, which complements the curriculum as a jumping off place to explore various subject areas such as literacy, art, math, social studies, and science. Age appropriate math facts and sight words will also be practiced weekly. The children will rotate through learning stations in small groups to maximize learning time.

- **Social Studies component:** In second grade, we will focus on learning about U.S. History using ***Our Star-Spangled Story Part 2***. This book has 45 lessons beginning with life in America in the late 1800s through modern times. Students will learn about history from a Christian worldview through songs, dances, and hands-on activities. Notgrass curriculum company recommends eight works of literature to read along with the lessons in Our Star-Spangled Story. The UHC teacher does not have time to read these books aloud in class but we highly recommend that families read through them at home with their students. Each book gives your child a richer perspective on a certain time period. The student has 3-5 weeks to read each book.

- **Science component:** In second grade, we will also complete Earth Science, Space Science & Physical Science unit studies about the earth, space, water, weather, and various physical science concepts (magnetism, gravity, electricity, etc..) based on the Magic School Bus series, enabling great flexibility as we explore a wide variety of science while integrating other subject areas. Students will participate in various hands-on activities and projects to further reinforce scientific methods of discovery.

Students also enjoy Music and Art class once weekly as part of their class day.

- **Music Class:** Students will attend music class once a week. The students will enjoy experiencing music in a variety of ways. We explore music through a repertoire rich in folk songs, nursery rhymes, and traditional singing games. We learn about music through imitation, movement, listening, visualization, improvisation, finger play, and rhythm instruments. Seasonal music activities are incorporated throughout the year.
- **Art Class:** Students will attend art class once a week. K4-2nd grade students' study of art will encourage them to better see and appreciate God's own artistic brilliance in His lavish creation. Quality children's literature will be used to teach various art elements such as shape, line, texture, color, value, form and space. Students will put their learning in action by completing an art project each class day using a variety of media and hands-on learning.

To be successful in this class:

Practice reading at home with parents, continue developing social skills, pay attention in class, raise hand in class, obey the teacher/follow instructions, learn to work in groups, keep hands to oneself, and continue to learn how to study material.

Course Description

The study of art at UHC helps students better see and appreciate God's own artistic brilliance in His lavish creation. Course Description

One Day Model:

Map Skills/Geography for 3rd grade focuses on the foundations of Geography with basic map skills by using various resources alongside hands-on activities and geography terms and vocabulary using Geography From A to Z for the fall semester. During the spring semester, students use the My Worldwide GeoJourney book to study Geography around the world and record their travels and findings. A \$20 supply fee for the Fall Map Skills packet and Spring World Geography Packet is included in this course.

Two Day Model:

Geography for 3rd grade will focus on an in-depth study of the 50 states of America using Notgrass Our 50 States. Students will learn geographic terms in relation to the topography of each state, all while practicing map skills. The curriculum includes two lessons per state, which includes facts about the history, physical features, population, and hands-on activities. Notgrass literature selections will also add to the depth of this comprehensive geography curriculum. Textbooks for the two day model

do not need to be purchased for home use unless a parent wants their own copy at home. A \$5 supply fee for a binder, pre-labeled dividers, and map packet is included in this course.

assignments with their students at home each week. Parents may need guidance working through the Fix It curriculum at home, and if so will need to purchase the [teacher's manual](#). Course Description

Course Description

History for 4th and 5th grades is taught on a two year rotation using the Notgrass America the Beautiful curriculum. America the Beautiful by Charlene Notgrass is an American history, geography, and literature course designed for students in grades 5-8. It combines the flexibility and richness of a unit study with the simplicity of a textbook-based approach to history.

Daily lessons guide the child chronologically through American history, highlighting key events, people, and places. Part 1 covers US History from 1000 through 1877 and Part 2 covers US History from 1877 to modern day. There are 15 units in each book.

Each week the student will have history homework to be completed. Homework will vary depending on if your child is signed up for the one day or two day model. See Homework Table below for more information about how the one day model will differ from the two day model. The teacher will be responsible for grading tests and quizzes. Both the one day and two day model will take history quiz JunoPods using JupiterEd.

Literature Component: America the Beautiful Notgrass curriculum has recommended literature books to use in conjunction with the History/Geography course. Parents may choose to incorporate the literature component independently if they so desire. The literature books recommended and which units of study they partner with can be found on the Notgrass website by clicking [HERE](#).

NOTE: Students enrolled at UHC for both 4th and 5th grades will complete the entire Notgrass America the Beautiful- Part 1 and Part 2 curriculum after those two years. Course Description

This class will introduce some of the core writing concepts that are taught in the upper level IEW classes at co-op. A primary concept covered is key word outlines and retelling and re-writing a source text. We will go over many examples in class, and the children also will have homework to complete each week. It is REQUIRED that 4th grade students type their compositions instead of hand writing them.

Additionally, we will work on editing and grammar skills using the IEW Fix-It program, [Fix It!™ Grammar: Level 2 Town Mouse and Country Mouse \[Student Book\]](#). Teachers will introduce new concepts each week, and parents will complete the grammar and editing assignments with their students at home each week. Parents may need guidance working through the Fix It curriculum at home, and if so will need to purchase the [teacher's manual](#). Course Description

History for 4th and 5th grades is taught on a two year rotation using the Notgrass America the Beautiful curriculum. America the Beautiful by Charlene Notgrass is an American history, geography, and literature course designed for students in grades 5-8. It combines the flexibility and richness of a unit study with the simplicity of a textbook-based approach to history.

Daily lessons guide the child chronologically through American history, highlighting key events, people, and places. Part 1 covers US History from 1000 through 1877 and Part 2 covers US History from 1877 to modern day. There are 15 units in each book.

Each week the student will have history homework to be completed. Homework will vary depending on if your child is signed up for the one day or two day model. See Homework Table below for more information about how the one day model will differ from the two day model. The teacher will be responsible for grading tests and quizzes. Both the one day and two day model will take history quiz JunoPods using JupiterEd.

Literature Component: America the Beautiful Notgrass curriculum has recommended literature books to use in conjunction with the History/Geography course. Parents may choose to incorporate the literature component independently if they so desire. The literature books recommended and which units of study they partner with can be found on the Notgrass website by clicking [HERE](#).

Course Description

This class will introduce some of the core writing concepts that are taught in the upper level IEW classes at co-op. A primary concept covered is key word outlines and retelling and re-writing a source text. We will go over many examples in class, and the children also will have homework to complete each week. It is REQUIRED that 5th grade students type their compositions instead of hand writing them.

Additionally, we will work on editing and grammar skills using the IEW Fix-It program, [Fix It!™ Grammar: Level 3 Robin Hood \[Student Book\]](#). Teachers will introduce new concepts each week, and parents will complete the grammar and editing assignments with their students at home each week. Parents may need guidance working through the Fix It curriculum at home, and if so will need to purchase the [teacher's manual](#). To learn more about this unique grammar and editing program please watch ["How IEW's Fix It! Course Description

Elementary Spanish is an elementary Spanish course that is a two year rotation. Each rotation will focus on teaching students beginner vocabulary, basic conversational phrases and exchanges, and would provide exposure to various Spanish countries and culture. The Spanish language would be introduced through a variety of methods including group discussions, hands-on activities, songs, and interactive group games. Students will work on correct pronunciation and accent.

Both rotations will develop students' basic understanding of the Spanish language through the alphabet, numbers, and verbs. The **2025-2026 rotation** will focus on vocabulary related to the outdoors (animals, weather, direction, seasons, clothes, and places). The **2026-2027 rotation** will focus on vocabulary related to the indoors (food, school, emotions, restaurants, family, the body, and pronouns). The work done in this class will be directed towards preparing the student for middle school Intro to Spanish.

In addition to the vocabulary focus for each rotation, there will also be a country focus. The **2025-2026 rotation** will focus on the country of Mexico and will introduce students to its rich history. Whereas the **2026-2027 rotation** will focus on the country of Spain. Both rotations will immerse the students in the culture, art, history, sports, and geography of the country.

Enrollment Info:

At enrollment, parents should indicate their desire to enroll their student in OG Reading Tutoring. The parent should provide the student's class schedule and any preferences as to time of day, etc for tutoring. The LD staff will add the student's name and tutoring preferences to the waitlist and the family will be contacted if/when a tutoring spot becomes available.

Course Description

Students enrolled in Orton-Gillingham Tutoring will meet between 8:00am – 3:30pm in individual or leveled groups of no more than 2 students after assessments are completed.

Each tutoring session will last 45 minutes weekly and the teacher will be using the Orton-Gillingham approach. The tutoring will be done in individual or small group sessions determined by students' reading levels, with no more than 2 students per small group. New students will need to attend an assessment time before the tutoring begins to determine their reading level and determine which leveled small group tutoring time they will be assigned. Once a tutoring spot becomes available for your student, you will be connected to a Reading Tutor who can set up a time to assess your child.

During the Orton-Gillingham approach, a student is taught reading, spelling, handwriting, and expressive writing as a whole body. The Orton-Gillingham approach is a multi-sensory approach and each phonetic unit and sequence in spoken and/or graphic form is learned through hearing, speaking, seeing, and writing; these skills are learned and practiced simultaneously in coordination with one another. The teacher teaches the student small doses of the language in 45 minutes tutoring sessions and connects their new learning to their prior knowledge of what they have

already learned. The tutor will monitor skill development for each student. The lessons are built upon what is observed in the previous lesson and what is seen to be necessary to move the child forward in the next lesson. This tutoring will not serve as the student's daily reading program. It will be a supplement to the instruction already occurring at home.

To be successful in this class:

Students must be actively working on a reading curriculum and practicing reading daily with their teaching parent. Tutors recommend using [All about Reading](#) and [All about Spelling](#) curriculum. Orton Gillingham Reading Tutoring should be viewed as an intervention to supplement what parents are doing at home. This tutoring time will be centered on Orton-Gillingham mini lessons focusing on certain reading skills/errors that are needed based on each small group reading needs and there will not be time in a 45 minutes weekly session to teach all reading skills comprehensively.

Parents must agree to:

- Purchase the required materials needed for the class
- Teach reading instruction on a daily basis with the student.
- Review content that is covered from weekly updates from tutor.

The OG tutor will:

- Teach new concepts and provide guided practice in class once a week.
- Provide support and suggestions for parents to use for reading and spelling at home.

Students NOT Enrolled in All Day Co-op Classes: Families from the community who do not plan to have their student enrolled in a regular, full day UHC Elementary co-op class, may enroll their student at UHC for Orton-Gillingham Reading Tutoring only. The annual student enrollment fee will be assessed to your account, in addition to the tuition for the tutoring, as is UHC's policy.
